


Date Night Idea

When was the last time you took a sip from an enamel mug?

I love a good enamel mug. Sipping coffee made over a campfire or warming a sip of bourbon on my outdoor fire pit... both using my favorite enamel mug. They are colorful and nostalgic. We have a small collection of them hung by little hooks in my garage. They are perfect for hiking and outdoor activities, especially camping due to their lightweight design and durability. These sturdy cups can hold heat without cracking, whether it is in the oven, on a stove, or directly over a campfire.

The story of enamel cookware begins in 1760 in Germany; however, I will not bore you with all the details. You can easily google enamelware to learn more. I did find it interesting to learn that the colors can give you an insight as to the mug's origin.

The blue-spotted Agateware became popular in the late 1890s. Early products were usually white. Usually, Britain produced white enamelware with a dark blue rim. Swedish products were cream-colored trimmed in green. Graniteware mimicked the look of granite with a specked gray and white design.

Enamelware experienced a surge in popularity due to its mid-20th century design. Soon designs decorated the enamelware with stenciled flowers, checkerboard prints, sentimental cartoons, marbling, fruits, polka dots, hearts, and leaves.

It's not just enamel mugs that are popular. Collectors search for plates, spoons, pots, pans, coffee pots, pitchers, and canisters. Most of these items be found on occasion at True North. They are smooth, easy-to-clean, and have become popular due to concerns over toxins in plastic products and no-stick pots and pans. They are easy to clean and safe to use.

These days, enamelware is more in- than outdoors. One reason is that the pieces are designed to fit flush inside one another and take up the minimum amount of space on your shelves. It also is so durable. It can last forever. Yes, it may chip around the edges if you are rough with them, but most collectors agree, that even with a few dents or scrapes, it is still perfect.

Did you know enamelware can be washed in a dish washer? With vintage enamel, it is best to wash everything down with water and a mild dish soap before doing anything major. This will get rid of any surface dirt and debris and allow you to better identify the underlying problem areas.

TIP: You can use a bit of bleach water to remove stains. Make sure you wash and rinse and dry. For stains, rub a paste of baking soda and water on the stain. Wash, rinse, and dry.





Crescent Bacon Breakfast Wreath

Bacon – Eggs – Cheese and more all wrapped up in Pillsbury store-bought crescent rolls. This is so easy to make and is good for breakfast or brunch! You can literally use any ingredients, but I provided some suggestions below. It's perfectly seasoned with Urban Accent's versatile, salt-free Sonoma Pepper Seasoning blend featuring bright lemon peel and warm black pepper that you can purchase at True North. I'm finding myself using this seasoning on everything lately...from eggs in the morning to a recent slow cooker roast.

Ok, back to the breakfast wreath. For maximum morning freedom, build this the night before, refrigerate, and pop it in the oven while the coffee brews. As I've said in the past, the kids are usually late, so I made this the night before.

Ingredients

- 6 eggs (Reserve one for egg wash!)
- 1/2 red pepper (diced)
- 1/2 green pepper (diced)
- 1 Tbsp Urban Accents Sonoma Pepper Seasoning Blend (available at True North)
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1 Tbsp butter
- · 8oz container store-bought crescent rolls
- 8 slices thick cut bacon, cooked (I suggest cooking in 400° oven for 15-20 mins on parchment paper & it comes out perfect and chewy rather than crispy.)
- 1 cup cheddar cheese, shredded
- chopped parsley (optional garnish) I garnish for guests, but not for family



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INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper or aluminum foil.
- 2. Crack 5 eggs into a bowl and beat until well combined. Stir in seasoning, salt, and diced peppers.
- **3.** Heat 1 Tbsp butter in a large sauce pan over medium heat. When melted, pour in seasoned eggs with pepper mixture. Stir occasionally until scrambled eggs are set, 3-5 minutes.
- 4. Open crescent roll tube (the pop always makes me jump), unroll dough, and separate pre-cut triangles do not roll them up! Arrange dough triangles on the baking sheet in a star pattern with the wider end of the triangles slightly overlapping in a rough circle. TIP: To create a round, even 'wreath', start by laying out 4 triangles each opposite the other in a North, South, East, West orientation. Then, add one in between each of the first.
- 5. Place one slice of cooked bacon onto each of the crescent triangles and spread shredded cheese along the inner circle where the triangles overlap. The second photo shows hash browns. As I said at the beginning, add anything you want.
- 6. Spoon scrambled eggs onto the cheese around the inner circle of the star, and gently fold the bacon and crescent dough points over the filling and tuck them under the inside of the wreath. This is the step where crispy bacon makes it difficult to fold.
- 7. Beat one egg and brush a thick layer of beaten egg onto the exposed crescent dough. This will make it beautifully golden brown and glossy.
- 8. Bake at 375° for 20-25 minutes. Check for browning at 15 minutes. If browning too quickly, tent with aluminum foil to prevent further browning.
- 9. Remove from oven and allow to cool for 2 minutes. Use two large spatulas to transfer to a serving dish and sprinkle with parsley (optional).



DIXIE BELLE PAINT

BIG MAMA'S BUTTA

OMG, this is my "Go-To" product from Dixie Belle Paint when I want to make something nice again.

Big Mama's Butta was originally created as an alternative to clear coat or wax when needing a sealer for painted pieces. It's all-natural and eco-friendly, cures in just 7 days, and is so soft and simple to use. Since it's release, there have been many more discoveries for it's use.

My favorite use is to simply hydrate and protect wood pieces. Buff and rub a small amount into the wood and the brilliance is restored! Butta is a STAPLE for any antique and primitive pieces. Drawers that are sticking? Rub a little on the parts that are supposed to slide and your problem is solved. Stinky, musty smell? Rub it in and it works to deodorize as well.

Leather pieces with scratches, scuffs, stiffening, or just blah...same process, rub a little in, buff it out, and it's brought back to life. Many people like to use it on vintage leather purses, luggage or boots. I have a beautiful, hunter green, vintage Coach crossbody and Butta made that color RICH again. It not only conditions the leather, but protects it because Butta is water resistant.

It's good for stainless steel too. Seems kinda weird right? But, I've heard from people that use it to bring shine to their stainless steel kitchen appliances: refrigerator, dishwasher, stove, and sinks. Clean the surfaces with a natural cleaner (ex. water and vinegar) then use a small amount of Butta and buff until it shines. Applying too much will make it greasy or slick, so start with tiny amounts. They have told me that it lasts about 30 days, repelling water and fingerprints. I don't have stainless appliances, but it sounds like it's worth a try to anyone that is always fighting those fingerprints.

Here's a use I never thought I would have heard about...ready?

INTERNATIONAL HARVESTER Paint Restoration! This lovely lady had her tin of Butta and was going around everything at her house using it wherever she thought it would make a difference. Apparently not even their antique tractor was safe from being a test model. Lol! Butta made it pretty again! She also even mentioned that it helped take out the haze on the headlights. Crazy right?!



I would guess it lasts a good 30 days or more, depending on where that tractor roams, but when the shows and parades are starting, this might be something to throw in the tool box to get her ready and shined up to show off.

Big Mama's Butta (BMB) comes in 2 scents: Suzanne's Garden (my favorite, smells like a rose garden) and Orange Grove (citrus scent). There is also an Unscented Butta that allows you to scent it yourself with essential oils. The recommendation is 4 drops of oil and 1 oz of Butta (give or take a couple drops depending on the strength of the scent).

*Big Mama's Butta contains coconut oil, beeswax, carnauba wax, and hemp seed oil. I do not recommend using it on white or light colored tones, it may yellow the finish because of the hemp-oil.





HOW DID YOU START YOUR BUSINESS?

It all started about 6 years ago when I won a raffle drawing at work. It was a Halloween deco mesh wreath and I loved it! The co-worker that made it directed me to a YouTube video with directions. I then made one myself..and then did 30-35 more wreaths that Christmas season. I thought ,"maybe I have something here"! It took me a while to take the plunge, but I did, and that is how Crafty Creations started.

Crafty Creations has expanded every year to what it is today, including Welcome signs, all different types of wood signs, crafts, nd wreaths made of more than just deco mesh and lots of seasonal crafts (it changes every year!). And now for the past 1.5 years Crafty Creations includes vintage and antique items! My husband's work territory used to be in the Morris area and he always stopped in the store. We talked about venturing into something like True North and finally took another plunge, with a lot of help from Stacey, the owner. WHAT IS ONE INTERESTING THING WE SHOULD KNOW ABOUT YOU?

Surprising fact – neither one of us knew anything about antiques/vintage before starting our booth at True North. It's not something we grew up with. We are learning all the time and LOVE it! We have found searching for the right things is so much fun! We are so blessed to have become part of the True North family and can't wait to see how True North and our business grows!




For many, decorating a room can seem like a daunting task. But once you define your style, decorating can become quite a fun adventure.


Scandi Style embraces a light, open and airy feel; wood tones are light, furniture is simple with smooth surfaces, monochromatic color schemes with white as a base.

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

HISTORY

Scout Flea Market (SFM) is entering its sixth season. It started in 2015 as an occasional market, partnering with Stash Handmade Market at the Kendall County Fairgrounds. In 2016, SFM went out on its own and hosted monthly markets, April thru October. In 2018 SFM moved to the parking lot of True North (TN).



THE NAME

One of the biggest question received is why is it called Scout Flea Market. It has nothing to do with the scouting organization, its simply name Scout because you are usually "scouting for good deals" at flea markets.



Scout Flea Market now partners with True North in producing the event. TN processes the applications and helps to execute the market day events. Being in the parking lot surrounding TN, SFM can easily accommodate 40+ vendors, plus can offer shoppers an additional 100 vendors inside the store too.

If you are looking for a fun market, look no further. SFM vendors can usually be found laughing, negotiating prices, sipping a beer, and having a good time. SFM strives to make the market as much for vendors as shoppers. Most markets feature live music, activities, and community organizations too. SFM: MAKER'S MARKET

Saturday, July 24, 2021 - 10am until 2pm

This event is specifically created to feature awesome, locally handmade crafters and Makers. The back parking lot will still have vendors with great flea market finds, as usual.

SFM: TAILGATE MARKET

Saturday, October 9, 2021 - 10am until 2pm

We are having a tailgate party. Vendors will set up and sell their cool junk and handmade items. Put on a flannel, buy food from the food trucks, play bean bags, drink a few beers, listen to LIVE music, heck, bring a lawn chair to enjoy the fun.

VENDORS

SFM vendors travel from all over, Indiana, Wisconsin, Chicago and all over Illinois. They bring antiques, vintage, furniture, salvage and handmade items at reasonable prices. At True North we have customers that ask us "What do people do with all these tiny parts and pieces?" Well, some are collected and displayed, others are upcycled into projects. Here is an easy DIY with some parts and pieces you can find around our store any time you stop in.

FUN & FUNKY BRACELETS

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- * Scrap Ribbon or Fabric Strips: Old linens, scarves, silk or t-shirts that will tear up nice and evenly.
- * A Focal Point: A charm, small belt buckle, discarded jewelry piece, embroidered patch, or any trinket that won't be too large on the wrist.
- * Scrap Leather: Old worn out belts are a good source for leather.
- * E6000 Adhesive: This is the best adhesive for making things stay put!
- * Wood, Hammer and Large Nail: any will do.









- 1. Start by cutting ribbon or fabric to the desired length. I like to leave a little extra just in case. It's easy to trim up when you're finished.
- 2. String on your trinket or treasure. If there's no way to string it on, you can always punch a hole in it or glue it on. I like to take pieces of leather and glue on to it.
- 3. Using a piece of wood, lay your piece of leather to be punched on top and hammer that nail right where you need a hole punched.
- 4. Once you punch a hole in the leather, then string your strip of fabric in one side from the top and out the other side from the bottom.
- 4. Wrap the fabric around your wrist, 1 time, 2 times, 3 times...it's your style, you rock it the way you want it.
- 5. Tie it off or if you're really fancy, you could add a toggle clasp.
 You're all done!

In January's issue of Tribe, I announced my New Year's Resolution to reinvent classic, albeit boring, cocktails. For February I really thought about all the things I love in the cocktail world. I remember years ago falling in love with drinking whiskey sours. It was the perfect combination of a robust bourbon or whiskey and a crisp fresh sour mix. It was refreshing in the summer and warmed me in the winter. I thought I had found the perfect cocktail. But things change. Life gets busy and sometimes it's easier to just pour my favorite bourbon over ice and call it a day. Now I could argue that that is a perfect cocktail on its own, but my New Year's Resolution made me think, "how could this be better?" Enter, the New York Sour.

Ingredients

2 oz Bourbon or Whiskey

1.5 oz sour mix: to make your own combine 1 cup of water and 1/2 cup sugar and simmer until the sugar has dissolved. Add 1 cup of lemon juice (1.5 cups if you like things tart)

1 egg white

Pinot Noir wine

Directions

Combine the egg white and sour mix in a shaker full of ice and shake vigorously. Then add bourbon and continue to shake. Empty into your favorite glass, leaving about a half inch of the glass empty to slowly pour over your favorite Pinot Noir.

If you are anything like 99% of the people I have gone to a bar with, you are probably disgusted by the thought of an egg white in your drink. Hear me out. First, the fresher the egg the better. And by better, I mean safer. If you know a chicken farmer personally, even better! Then by combining the sour mix and egg white in the shaker first, you are giving the citrus a chance to kill off anything that may be harmful. So why an egg white? It's purely textural. It adds a velvety, fluffy texture that is indescribably delicious. Imagine a wonderful lemon meringue pie but in a glass...with alcohol. And the piece de resistance, the Pinot Noir. Don't worry, you don't need to buy the most expensive bottle for this to be delicious.
