
Be sure you never miss an issue also by adding True North to your address book. Email's from us tend to slip into junk mail folders.






THELMA & LOUISE






INTERN




Items are added every hour, and most vendors restock at least once a week. That's a lot of clothing, adding up to a lot of hoices.




All of the greeting cards found at True North are made by small businesses/makers in the USA, with the majority of them in the Midwest. Here are a few of our favorites.


BENCH PRESSED Minneapolis, MN


TWENTYSOME DESIGN Chicago, IL
